➤ **Question:** How did you communicate with people about the carers event and do you have any other events planned?

Answer: Posters were displayed in the surgery and frontline staff promoted the event. The event took place during carer's week. Plan to evaluate whether to host another event this year.

Vale Medical Group

Considering a sub-committee for young families, so that they can meet at a time that is suitable to them and then report into the existing PPG.

Working alongside the practice manager, creating a patient enquiry system to identify what patients have found useful and less successful.

Circulate 5 on Friday newsletters to Facebook groups and add information to those posts, highlighting key and local points. PPG also has its own email address.

- Question: How did you recruit a PPG member who was under the age of 19?
 Answer: The member was approached after somebody she knew suggested to the PPG that she would be interested.

South Leicestershire Medical Group

A working group focussed on a long-term goal to reach rural and cultural communities is being developed.

- The Health+ project has received more funding, so the offer to support patients over 50 to utilise digital health apps and improve digital skills has been extended. If your practice is interested,

Please see below summary of the Health+ project:

Health+ was set up across Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland in August 2021. Reaching People received funding from NHS Charites together. They are helping patients at surgeries to access GP online services, find health information online and to use the NHS App in addition to other objectives around the digital health agenda.

Between February 2022 and March 2023 digital companions interacted with 176 patients in surgeries in Leicester, Leicestershire and Rutland. The project has reached a total of 200 people this figure includes 152 people who were supported at surgeries, plus 48 people who attended the 'Introduction to the NHS App' online and in-person sessions.

Patients were given three statements about our support and were asked to rate them. The results were as follows:

- o 'You feel more confident about finding information online to do with your health and wellbeing' had a positive confidence level of 85%.
- 'You feel more confident using online health services' had a positive confidence level of 89%.
- o 'Your digital skills have improved' had a positive confidence level of 86%.

A volunteer from the Health+ project has developed 6 videos, aimed at older people, showing them how to use the NHS app. They can be found on the YouTube Channel: <u>Leicshealthplus</u>

They are a few more videos on the way and if people subscribe to the channel they will see when new content is uploaded. The videos currently available are:

Introduction to the NHS App
Creating an NHS Account Pt 1
Creating An NHS Account Pt2
Creating An NHS Account Pt3
NHS App Functions
Accessing Messaging, Health Apps and Prescription Functions

Friday is exploring whether the videos can be translated to other languages.

- Practice Managers are being supported by the Engagement and Insights Team to reinvigorate their PPGs. A pilot practice sent messages to patients interested in joining the PPG. Birju, representing the Integrated Care Board, attended a meeting with 12 of those patients to discuss the benefits of a PPG, as well as the role of the Chair and members. Going forward, this will be offered to practices that request support.
- The local NHS volunteer recruitment campaign is underway. Practices have received a toolkit that
 contains messages for texts, newsletters and websites. Posters and postcards are available. Three
 voluntary organisations have been commissioned to target specific demographics to encourage
 more volunteers from underrepresented groups. The campaign has been launched to wider
 stakeholders including local councils, churches, and partner organisations.
